## MOO LET'S TALK RAISED OVER \$34,000 FOR CMHA-PEI

**Charlottetown ---** The Canadian Mental Health Association, PEI Division (CMHA-PEI) is pleased to announce that Moo Let's Talk Day hosted on March 8, 2019 at COWS Inc. by Patrick Ledwell and the Meek family was an overwhelming success with thousands of Islanders visiting the COWS Creamery, and COWS Queen Street store to buy ice cream, special edition t-shirts, and/or make a donation, but more importantly to talk about mental health.

Money raised through the Moo Let's Talk campaign totaled \$34,445.55, with the sale of ice cream, t-shirts and the donation of March 8ths tips from staff to round up the COWS Inc. contribution to \$30,337. The rest of the money collected came in the form of donations made directly to CMHA-PEI and corporate sponsorships to help cover promotional costs.

"We're pleased to be able to make this donation to CMHA-PEI, however, as we stressed last year, the money raised is secondary to what the day meant. The people that came in and supported this event and shared their personal stories of how mental illness has impacted their lives was incredible. Thank you to Patrick Ledwell and the Meek family for donating their time to helping us reach even more people with positive mental health messages", says Jackie McIntyre, President and CEO of COWS Inc.

CMHA confirms that a portion of this donation will be allocated to delivering more free safeTALK sessions across the province. safeTALK is a half-day alertness training that prepares anyone 15 years of age or older, regardless of prior experience or training, to become a suicide-alert helper. Patrick lives on a hobby farm outside Charlottetown, PEI with his wife Tara and son Nate.

**Darin, Kathleen and Taylor Meek** live in Stratford, PEI. On January 13, 2012 they suffered an unimaginable loss when their daughter Chalyce, Taylor's sister, took her own life at the age of 17. The Meek's have been very open about their daughter's struggles, the help they sought and the grief that followed her passing. They are strong supporters, volunteers and advocates for the Canadian Mental Health Association and Kid's Help Phone. Darin and Kathleen work for Bell and Taylor is studying Business Administration at UPEI.

**MOO LET'S TALK** is an annual fundraising event and general awareness campaign hosted by COWS Inc. Parodied after the popular Bell Let's Talk, Moo Let's Talk is designed to encourage people to talk about their mental health, seek help if they need it, and raise funds for mental health programs and services delivered in the province of Prince Edward Island.

**COWS Inc.** was established in Prince Edward Island in 1983 and has grown from one shop in Cavendish to 11 stores across Canada and one in Beijing, China. The COWS CREAMERY located on Capital Drive offers tours where visitors can watch their old fashioned, hand-made ice cream recipes being made.
